a. **St Mary the Virgin, Hillington Church.** Presented by Laura Worsley:

Challenging times with the pandemic and adhering to government safety guidance have meant that regular onsite church services were largely cancelled over the past year with online ones held instead. Despite this, we were lucky to be able to open the Church for individual prayer at times, gather for Remembrance Day prayers by the Hillington memorial and more recently to welcome people to a service of thanksgiving for the life of HRH the Duke of Edinburgh. Sunday services have now been resumed and we are back to the regular bi-monthly (1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday) schedule. Some of the loveliest moments have been the beautiful flower displays arranged by villagers over the Harvest, Christmas, and Easter periods when the Church was re-opened for quiet reflection. We have been very appreciative of everyone's efforts.

For the first time this year, we were unable to pay the Hillington Parish share to the Diocese, as finances were badly affected by lack of services. However, the church grounds, continue to be maintained to a very high level by Ozzie our gardener and his salary has been paid, in part by the generosity of the Hillington Parish Council.

Over the past year, our rare and wonderful Snetzler organ has come into good use, allowing us to host organ practice and study days to supplement Church income. We are delighted to announce a major fundraising project being organised for 25<sup>th</sup> September, 2021. This will include a Study Day for organists across the county, followed by an early evening recital concert given by Julian Haggett, MISM. Tickets will go on sale in June. We hope this will be a joyous, uplifting event and welcome all interested villagers to attend!
